The course defines the term" Human rights" and gives a brief historical background about these rights. It then classifies types and divisions of human rights applying them to international treaties and local constitutions highlighting how to secure applications and implementation of such rights. The course also tackles international recognition of human rights, international declaration of human rights, and international treaties. The course also tackles basic concepts of human rights and provides an actual analysis of the local and international methods concerned with human rights such as:

International treaties and recommendations .It also discusses rights of the first generation like the right to live, in addition to rights of the second generation like: the right to work and those of the third generation like right of environment. The course also tackles the international means to secure humans by legal means (report system, states and individuals complaints, investigation committees) or by using economic and political pressures or using force for the interest of humanity. The course also considers the solution of current problems, from the viewpoint of students such as: honor crimes, violence against, Women and execution punishment
