Readings will be selected from the works of representative writers such as Franklin ,Irving, Poe , Hawthorne, Melville, Emerson, Thoreau , Whitman, Emily Dickinson, Henry James, Jonathan Edwards, and Stephen Crane.

- 2. To compare and contrast cultures.
- 3. To pass judgments.
