Students are expected to master the major topic areas in the voice production process (articulatory Phonetics) including: the description of speech sounds (consonants and vowels); and the phonetic transcription using the IPA and the Cardinal Vowel Chart.

To enable students of English to produce English sounds (consonants & vowels) correctly as well as distinguish between these sounds on the basis of phonetic transcription and their corresponding pronunciation.
